Session 9: Questions Concerning Baptism



- I. Is baptism required for salvation? (Acts 2:36-41)
 - A. The question.
 - 1. The Message: God has made this Jesus whom <u>you</u> crucified both Lord and Christ.
 - 2. The conviction: They were cut to the heart.
 - 3. The question: "What shall we do?"

B. The answer.

- 1. Repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ FOR the remission of sins.
- 2. For because of.
- 3. Repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus because of the remission of sin.

C. Is Baptism important?

- 1. Each individual is commanded to be baptized. (Acts 2:38)
- 2. The church is <u>commissioned</u> to baptize.
- 3. Baptism is expected.

II. Why do we rebaptize those who come from another denomination?

- A. Apollos in Ephesus. (Acts 18:24-26)
 - 1. Apollos a good man.
 - 2. Apollos only knew the baptism of John.
 - 3. Apollos theology was not correct.

B. Paul in Ephesus.

- 1. Paul discovers disciples.
- 2. Paul <u>examines</u> their theology.
- 3. Paul <u>rebaptized</u> them.

C. Contentions concerning baptism. (1 Corinthians 1:11-17)

- 1. Corinth, a divided congregation.
- 2. The source of their division was good men.
- 3. The subject of their division was <u>baptism</u>.

III. Is infant baptism scriptural?

- A. Infant Baptism began in the Roman Catholic Church.
- B. There is <u>NO</u> scriptural foundation for infant baptism.
